### YOUR FIRST CHOICE WHEN STUDYING ABROAD

O'Sullivan College is a private college with approximately 500 students. Our Designated Educational Institution Number (EED/DLI number) is **O19 358 463 079**. The College is a DLI with a COVID-19 readiness plan approved by the province.

Because O'Sullivan is a small college, our students are provided with excellent training and individual attention, leading to an easier integration for our international students. Programs are offered in French and/or English and lead to a diploma or attestation of collegial studies which prepares students to enter the work force immediately upon graduation or to pursue their studies at the university level. The college offer these programs: Network management and IT security, Technologie des médias et plateau de tournage, Paralegal Technology and Medical Records.

O'Sullivan College, located in the heart of downtown Montreal, has enjoyed a reputation of excellence in the business community since its foundation in 1916. Over the years, we have welcomed students from the Dominican Republic, Morocco, Algeria, Japan, Tunisia, Panama, Colombia, China, Korea, Mexico; as well as from different other countries in Africa and Asia.

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Admission to O'Sullivan College is based on your academic record from secondary school and/or a post-secondary education. International students must possess the equivalent of a High School Leaving Certificate/Diploma. Also, they might have to pass a French or English proficiency exam, if necessary, in order to be admitted to the program. Every year, new semesters begin in late August and mid-January.



Since the process of obtaining legal authorization to study can take more than 4 months, and international students must obtain a study permit before leaving their country, candidates must apply by August 31<sup>st</sup> for the January session, and by March 1<sup>st</sup> for the August session.

## DOCUMENTS NEEDED TO APPLY TO O'SULLIVAN COLLEGE

- Admission form

- Application fee of \$100 (Canadian dollars)
- Official copy of last high school transcript (i.e. “pre-university”)
- Last college or university transcript
- Results of language test, if necessary, depending on whether English (or French) is your second language (TOEFL for English). A free online test is offered at the college;
- Birth certificate and passport.

## COSTS



In order to obtain the official letter of acceptance for a study permit, the international student must pay the registration fees.

**Medical insurance:** In order to obtain a study permit, all international students must have a health and hospitalization insurance. O'Sullivan College offers such insurance through insurance brokers or they can purchase by themselves.

## PROCEDURE TO FOLLOW IN ORDER TO OBTAIN YOUR STUDY PERMIT

1. Make your admission request at O'Sullivan College, including a copy of all the necessary documents and the \$100 application fee.
2. Once your admission is accepted, the College will send you by email an educational services contract. You must then sign one copy and return it with your registration fee payment of \$250. This is necessary in order for the College to give you the "official" letter needed to make a request for your C.A.Q. (Certificate of Acceptance of Quebec). You should note that the Educational Contract is NOT considered an "official" acceptance for obtaining your C.A.Q.
3. It is recommended to apply for a C.A.Q. online at [www.immigration-quebec.gouv.qc.ca](http://www.immigration-quebec.gouv.qc.ca).
4. Once you obtain your C.A.Q., you can submit your application for your study permit. You must apply to the Canadian Visa Office covering the country where you currently reside or consult the Canadian Embassy or Canadian Consulate in your country or in the country you are presently in. It is very important to note that you CANNOT apply for a study permit once you are in Canada.
